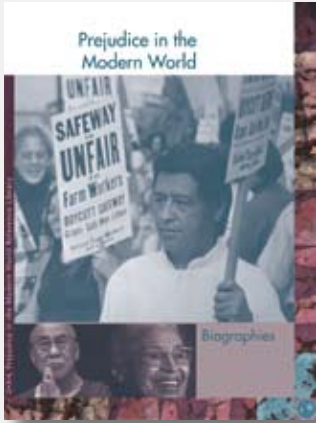



# Prejudice in the Modern World Reference Library

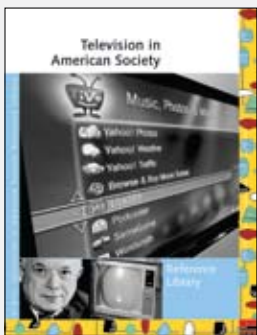
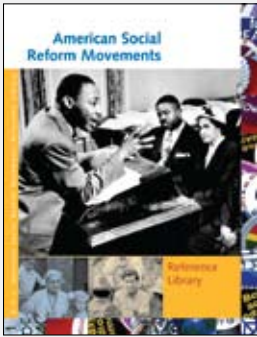
